



## CHEVROLET NEW VEHICLE WARRANTY

Chevrolet Motor Division, General Motors Corporation, the manufacturer (herein referred to as "Chevrolet"), warrants to the original retail purchaser each new 1969 model Chevrolet passenger car and chassis (herein referred to as "Vehicle"), including all equipment and accessories thereon (except tires) supplied or manufactured by Chevrolet, to be free from defects in material and workmanship under normal use and service during the time and mileage limits and subject to the limitations and exclusions hereinafter set forth.

### LIMITATIONS

**TIME AND MILEAGE**  
This Warranty applies to the entire Vehicle (except tires) for 12 months after the date of delivery to the original retail purchaser or until the Vehicle has been driven for 12,000 miles, whichever first occurs.

Upon the expiration of the 12 months/12,000 miles Warranty coverage this Warranty continues to apply to the Vehicle's powertrain components (specifically, (1) cylinder block, head, all internal engine parts, water pump and intake manifold; (2) transmission case and all internal transmission parts including torque converter; (3) propeller shaft and universal joints; (4) rear axle, differential and axle shafts) until the expiration of five years from the date of delivery to the original retail purchaser or until it has been driven for 50,000 miles, whichever first occurs.

If, at the time of delivery to the original retail purchaser, the Vehicle has been in factory or dealer service (as a demonstrator, for example) the time and mileage limitations shall be calculated from the date the Vehicle was first placed in such factory or dealer service.

### MANUFACTURERS OBLIGATION

Chevrolet's obligation under this Warranty is limited to repairing or replacing, at its option, any part or parts which are returned to an authorized Chevrolet dealer at such dealer's place of business and which examination shall disclose to Chevrolet's reasonable satisfaction to have been defective in material or workmanship. Such repair or replacement shall be performed by any authorized Chevrolet dealer at such dealer's place of business without charge.

### EXCLUSIONS

This Warranty shall not apply to:

- (1) Any Vehicle on which the odometer mileage has been altered and the Vehicle's actual mileage cannot be readily determined;
- (2) Any Vehicle for which the owner does not possess a Chevrolet Protect-O-Plate issued in owner's name for such Vehicle;
- (3) Normal maintenance services (such as engine tune up, fuel system cleaning, carbon or sludge removal, brake and clutch adjustments and wheel alignment and balancing);
- (4) The replacement of service items (such as spark plugs, ignition points, positive crankcase ventilator valves, filters and brake and clutch linings) made in connection with normal maintenance services;
- (5) Normal deterioration of soft trim and external appearance items due to wear and exposure;
- (6) The repair or replacement of any part the failure of which is caused by lack of performance of required maintenance as specified by Chevrolet in the 1969 New Vehicle Warranty and Owner Protection Plan folder;
- (7) Any part of any Vehicle which has been subject to misuse, negligence, alteration or accident, or which shall have been repaired outside of an authorized Chevrolet dealer's place of business so as in any way, in the reasonable judgment of Chevrolet, to affect adversely its performance and reliability; or
- (8) Any Vehicle registered and normally operated outside the United States or Canada (the warranty applicable to such Vehicle shall be that authorized by General Motors in the country where such Vehicle is registered and normally operated).

### SOLE WARRANTY

This Warranty is the only warranty applicable to the vehicle and is expressly in lieu of all other warranties, expressed or implied, including any implied warranty of Merchantability or Fitness For A Particular Purpose.

## AVAILABILITY OF UNEXPIRED WARRANTY TIME AND MILEAGE COVERAGE TO THE SECOND RETAIL PURCHASER

If the Vehicle is acquired by a second retail purchaser at any time prior to the expiration of five years from the date of delivery to the original retail purchaser and before the Vehicle has been driven 50,000 miles, the second retail purchaser may obtain a Protect-O-Plate on the Vehicle entitling him to the benefits of the unexpired portion of the Warranty coverage to the original retail purchaser, subject to the provisions, limitations and exclusions of such Warranty, provided:

- (1) Application for the Protect-O-Plate is made to an authorized Chevrolet dealer within 30 days or 1,000 miles Vehicle usage, whichever first occurs, following the date of purchase of the Vehicle by the second retail purchaser;
  - (2) A fee of \$25 is paid to the dealer; and
  - (3) The dealer advises Chevrolet that inspection indicates the Vehicle has received required maintenance as specified by Chevrolet in the 1969 New Vehicle Warranty and Owner Protection Plan folder.
- It is a condition to Chevrolet's obligation to the second retail purchaser, who holds a Chevrolet Protect-O-Plate in his name that such second retail purchaser pay the first \$25.00 on each repair or replacement made with respect to each powertrain component under the Warranty after the period between the expiration of the 12 months/12,000 miles coverage and prior to expiration of the 5 years/50,000 miles coverage.

### OWNER RESPONSIBILITY

Proper maintenance and care of the Vehicle will help you achieve lower over-all operating costs. Also, regular and proper maintenance of the Vehicle by competent technicians will help you avoid conditions arising from neglect which are not covered by the Chevrolet New Vehicle Warranty.

As an express condition of the Chevrolet New Vehicle Warranty, the maintenance services described below are to be performed at the specified intervals by an authorized Chevrolet Dealer or any service station or garage regularly providing such services. Additional recommended maintenance services are described in the 1969 Chevrolet Owner's Manual which will help you get the utmost in satisfaction and extended service from the Vehicle.

### REQUIRED MAINTENANCE SCHEDULE

As an express condition of the Chevrolet New Vehicle Warranty, the following maintenance operations are to be performed at the specified intervals:

- ENGINE OIL**—Change every 4 months or 6,000 miles, whichever occurs first, or every 2 months or 3,000 miles under certain operating conditions. (See Owner's Manual.)
- OIL FILTER**—Replace at first oil change and every second oil change thereafter.
- CHASSIS LUBRICATION**—Lubricate suspension every 4 months or 6,000 miles, whichever occurs first. Maintain all oil and fluid levels.
- CARBURETOR AIR CLEANER**—Inspect and test every 12,000 miles, replace if necessary.
- POSITIVE CRANKCASE VENT VALVE**—Replace each 12 months or 12,000 miles, whichever occurs first. (Clean PCV fixed orifice on Corvair.)
- AUTOMATIC TRANSMISSION SERVICE**—Drain and replenish fluid every 24,000 miles. (Adjust Powerglide low band at first fluid change, except Corvair.) (Replace Turbo Hydra-Matic sump strainer at 24,000 miles.)
- ENGINE COOLANT**—Drain and replenish every two years. Refer to your 1969 Owner's Manual for further information on vehicle maintenance.

### POLICY ON CHEVROLET OWNER SERVICE

- 1. New Vehicle Warranty and Protect-O-Plate**—A Vehicle can only be eligible for warranty if it qualifies under the provisions of the Warranty and the owner possesses a Protect-O-Plate issued by Chevrolet in his name for such Vehicle. This folder and Protect-O-Plate must be delivered to the person to whom you sell your Vehicle.
- 2. Delivery**—To help you secure maximum satisfaction with your Chevrolet, it has been serviced and conditioned according to Chevrolet's established pre-delivery service and adjustment check sheet by the authorized Chevrolet Dealer who sold you your car.
- 3. Warranty Service—United States and Canada**—If you are touring or in the event you move, service under the Chevrolet New Vehicle Warranty will be performed by any Chevrolet Dealer in the United States or Canada. In all other cases, it is recommended that warranty services be performed by the authorized Chevrolet Dealer who sold you your car because of the Dealer's continued and personal interest in you.

In normal passenger car use against road hazard occurrences such as blowouts, fabric breaks, cuts, bruises, and snags, which in the opinion of the tire manufacturer render the tire unserviceable. Damage from punctures, running flat, fire, wrecks, chain cuts, irregular wear, abuse, etc. are not covered. Adjustments under the road hazard guarantee are made in the same manner as those under the basic guarantee.

The above described tire guarantees are the only ones issued by the tire manufacturers, and they specifically provide that consequential damages are not covered by the guarantees.

Any authorized Chevrolet Dealer will assist you in requesting an adjustment if this becomes necessary. For the added convenience of owners, many Chevrolet dealers are equipped to handle tire warranty adjustments on tires provided by Chevrolet on 1969 Chevrolet cars.

### NOTICE TO SECOND PURCHASER

The second retail purchaser of the Vehicle identified by the Vehicle Identification Number shown above may apply for a Protect-O-Plate entitling him to any unexpired portion of the Warranty coverage for a fee of \$25 through an authorized Chevrolet dealer. Application must be made within 30 days or 1,000 miles of Vehicle usage, whichever first occurs, following the date of purchase, and the dealer must inspect the Vehicle and advise Chevrolet that it has received the required maintenance. The second purchaser, upon issuance of the Protect-O-Plate, will be required to pay the first \$25 on each repair or replacement of warranted power train components made during the period between the expiration of the 12 months/12,000 miles coverage and the 5 years/50,000 miles coverage.
